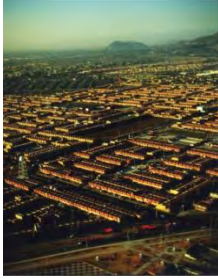

Normal Fee: 250 Euros

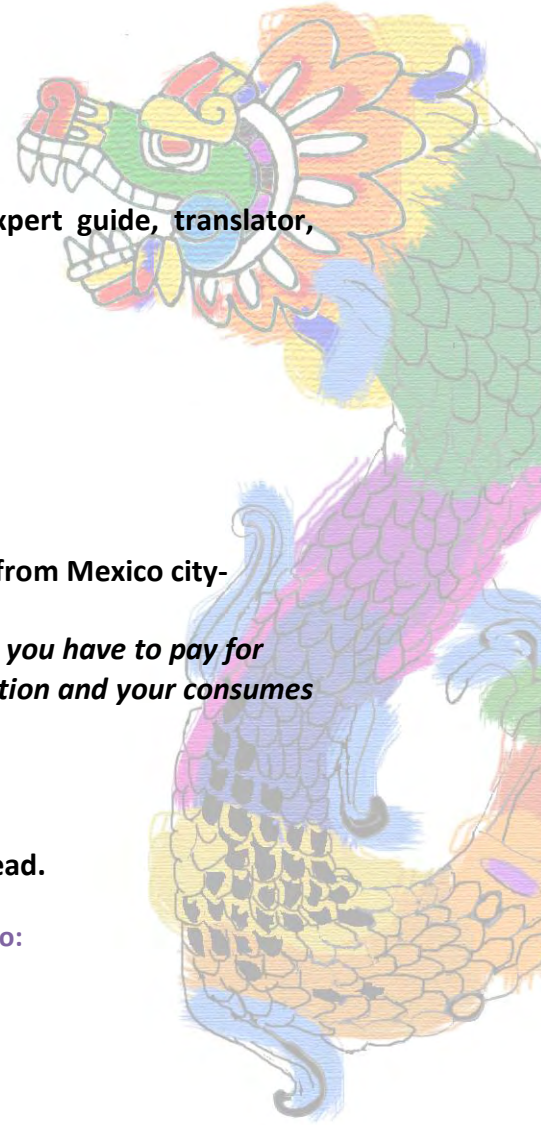

TEOTIHUACAN, one of the most interesting archeological sites is just a few Kilometers from the big Metropolis, we have organized a visit to this ancient City that once had a population of about 200 000 inhabitants. We shall spend the day walking along the big avenue that connects the main excavated buildings. The two biggest structures are the so called Sun and Moon Pyramid; artificial mounts began to be built around 200 b.c. It was the center of Obsidian production; hundreds of workshops supplied all of Mesoamerica, lava glass as sharp as a Samurai sword or a doctor's finest scalpel.
